### 2030 OCCUPATIONAL PROJECTIONS BY EDUCATION


#### THE BIG PICTURE

Employment in Rhode Island is projected to grow at all education and skill levels, from jobs requiring less than a high school diploma to those requiring advanced degrees. During the 2020-2030 projection period, it is estimated that employers will need to find workers to fill over 56,000 new jobs and to replace over 557,000 workers who will leave their jobs for various reasons.

Parallel to the national distribution, jobs requiring a high school diploma for entry into an occupation represent the largest portion of the Rhode Island labor market. Thirty six percent of Rhode Island jobs typically require a high school education; slightly lower than the national percentage (38.4%). Between 2020 and 2030, there are nearly 218,000 openings projected for occupations at this educational level.

Jobs requiring college degrees (Associate, Bachelor's, Master's or Doctoral) represent nearly thirty three percent (32.8%) of the current occupational distribution in Rhode Island, slightly higher than the national average (30.1%). During the projection period it is estimated that there will be more than 144,000 openings for occupations requiring a minimum of an Associate degree in Rhode Island.
