

Jobs Increase by 400 in October

The October jobs report revealed that Rhode Island's Total Nonfarm employment level of 513,400 was up 400 from the revised September employment level of 513,000. The job count is up 9,000 from a year ago.

Job gains were in the Accommodation & Food Services (+1,100), and Wholesale Trade (+200) sectors. Job losses were in the Government (-500), Educational Services (-200) and Financial Activities (-200) sectors.



Labor Supply & Demand in Rhode Island

Unemployment Insurance (UI) claimants represent an able and available supply of trained workers who are currently seeking work. Online postings represent a current demand for labor detailing the types of occupations employers are seeking to fill.

On September 30, 2024, the Department of Labor and Training's EmployRI online network recorded 6,904 online job postings compared to 14,107 in third quarter 2023. Also in September, 7,676 RI residents collected unemployment insurance benefits in contrast with 6,902 for the same period last year.

The share of job postings for which the usual educational requirement was either a bachelor's or an associate degree was 30 percent. Claimants with those degrees represented 18 percent of the total collecting. The share of job postings for which the usual education requirement was a high school degree or lower was 39 percent, while the number of claimants with that level of education represented 47 percent of the total collecting.

A labor surplus was associated with thirteen major occupational groups. The greatest labor surplus was associated with the Construction & Extraction group for which there were 7.1 UI claimants with this type of work experience for every online Construction & Extraction occupation posting.

Labor shortages were found in five of the major occupational groups for the current quarter, with the severest shortages occurring in the Healthcare Practitioners & Technical and Architecture & Engineering groups.
