

Jobs Increase by 400 in March

The March jobs report revealed that Rhode Island's Total Nonfarm employment level of 515,600 was up 400 from the revised February employment level of 515,200. The job count is up 3,700 from a year ago.

Job gains were in the Professional & Business Services (+500), Construction (+400), Health Care & Social Assistance (+400) and Private Educational Services (+300) sectors. Job losses were in the Government (-400) and Retail Trade (-300) sectors.



Tax Exempt Employment in Rhode Island

The 1,708 tax-exempt employers registered in Rhode Island paid over 4.9 billion dollars in wages to their 76,208 workers accounting for 15.6 percent of the state's private sector employment and 17.8 percent of the total private sector wages paid in 2023. Wages in the tax-exempt sector average \$64,431 on par with the taxable average wage of \$64,435.

- Nearly 80 percent of the state's tax-exempt employment was found in the state's Private Education and Healthcare & Social Assistance sectors dominating the total employment in both sectors.
- Tax-exempt wages in the Health Care & Social Assistance sector averaged \$66,434 compared to the \$54,757 average paid to the sector's taxable workers.
- Tax-exempt wages in the Private Education sector averaged \$68,908, over 30 percent more than the sector's taxable average of \$52,049.
- The Management of Companies tax-exempt wages averaged \$81,674; 46.2 percent less than the average of the sector's taxable wages of \$151,713.
