Jobs Increase by 500 in August

The August jobs report revealed that Rhode Island's Total Nonfarm employment level of 513,700 was up 500 from the revised July employment level of 513,200. The job count is up 1,700 from a year ago.

Job gains were in the Professional & Business Services (+1,100), Construction (+500) and Transportation & Utilities (+400) sectors. Job losses were in the Health Care & Social Assistance (-700), Accommodation & Food Services (-600) and Wholesale Trade (-400) sectors.



Rhode Island Employment by Size of Firm

The Rhode Island economy is characterized by a large number of small companies employing a small number of workers. In March 2025, there were 45,239 private businesses in the state employing 427,086 workers.

Half of the employers (51.3%) in the state have between one and four employees; however, they employ just 9.3 percent of the workforce. The largest employers, those with 1,000 or more employees, numbered 31 (0.1%) and employed 17.0 percent of Rhode Island's private sector workforce.

- Smaller employers, those with less than 20 employees, represented 92.4 percent of all employers in the state and employed over one quarter (26.6%) of the workforce.
- Mid-sized companies (20 to 99 workers) employed 26.5 percent of the private sector workforce and accounted for 6.3 percent of the firms.
- There are just 572 (1.3%) firms in the state employing 100 or more workers. Together, these firms employ nearly half (46.9%) of the state's private sector employees.
