


RHODE ISLAND'S OCCUPATIONAL EMPLOYMENT BY GENDER

2024 Rhode Island Median Earnings by Educational Attainment,
Population Aged 25+ with Earnings



In 2024, Rhode Island's male residents (aged 16+) earned a median annual wage of \$58,681. In comparison, Rhode Island's female residents earned a median annual wage of \$48,324. Wages for both groups varied based on occupation and educational attainment levels. Legal occupations paid the highest wages for both males, averaging \$150,351, and females at \$113,702. Earnings for males were lowest in Farming, Fishing & Forestry (\$18,150) occupations, while earnings for females were lowest in Food Preparation & Serving Related (\$14,591) occupations.

For individuals aged 25 and older, wages averaged \$60,653 for men and \$51,244 for women. Men and women both benefit from higher levels of education, where wages ranged from a low of \$31,706 for men with less than a high school education to a high of \$100,100 for men with advanced degrees. Wages for women ranged from a low of \$32,040 for women with less than a high school education to a high of \$81,880 for women with advanced degrees.

US Census data show there is often a clear difference between the career choices of men and women. While men dominate Installation, Maintenance & Repair and Construction & Extraction occupations; women represent higher percentages of the workers in Healthcare Support and Healthcare Practitioners & Technical occupations.
