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# INTRODUCTION

## State of the State – A Statistical Profile of Rhode Island’s Cities and Towns

From Burrillville to Block Island, from Woonsocket to Westerly, recent demographic and employment trends have impacted the lives of all Rhode Islanders. Incorporating information collected by the United States Department of Commerce and the Rhode Island Department of Labor and Training, State of the State depicts demographic changes and recent employment trends that have impacted our local economies over the last twenty years.

Population diversity based on age, sex, race, and ethnicity, as well as educational attainment, labor force statistics, and English language proficiency of local residents, is encapsulated in statistical profiles for each of Rhode Island’s thirty-nine communities. An overview of local private sector employment by industry sector is also provided on a city and town basis.

# OVERVIEW

As of 2024, total job levels averaged 495,173, an increase of 7,199 (+1.5%) from the 2023 average. The unemployment rate is down 8.6 percentage points from 2010 to 3.0 percent in 2023. The state's population count stood at 1,094,250 in 2022, up 41,683 from 2010.

Twenty-nine of the state's thirty-nine cities and towns reported total employment growth between 2023-2024, with Barrington having the largest over-the-year increase (+7.3%). Cumberland posted the largest total employment decrease (-7.0%)

As of 2024, Providence establishments employed the largest percentage (22.6%) of Rhode Island private sector workers, followed by Warwick (10.1%), Cranston (6.8%), East Providence (4.9%) and North Kingstown (4.8%).

Between 2022 and 2023, twenty-two cities and towns gained residents, with Providence (+1,225), Cranston (+276) and Lincoln (+244) adding the most people. Of the seventeen cities and towns that lost residents, Newport (-295), Middletown (-202) and Portsmouth (-183) lost the most.

Rhode Island (4.3%) was tied for the 11th highest annual average unemployment rate in the country in 2024. Nevada (5.6%), had the highest rate in the country. The annual average unemployment rate for the United States as a whole in 2023 was 4.0 percent.

Rhode Island's total population increased by 4.3 percent during the 2010's, with the gain of 44,812 people, while between 2020 and 2023, Rhode Island lost 2,008 (-0.2%) residents.

Over forty-five percent (45.4%) of Rhode Island residents 25 years and older had a college degree (Associate or higher) in 2023. The share of state residents without a high school diploma or GED decreased between 2010 and 2023, falling from 16.4 percent to 10.5 percent.

Between 2023 and 2024, employment in Rhode Island increased by 7,199 (+1.5%) jobs. Private sector employers reported a gain of 6,362 (+1.5%) jobs, while public sector employment grew by 838 (+1.4%) jobs.

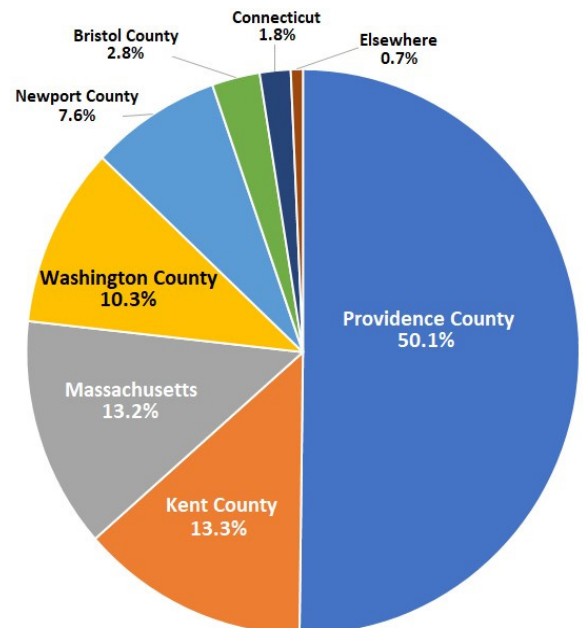

# STATE OF RHODE ISLAND

The percentage of Rhode Islanders who spoke only English or spoke another language and English either well or very well increased from 94.7 percent in 2010 to 95.8 percent in 2023.

The percentage of total residents aged 18 to 64 that spoke Spanish while speaking English either not well or not at all decreased from 3.7 in 2010 to 3.4 in 2023, representing 23.8 percent of all Spanish-speaking Rhode Islanders.

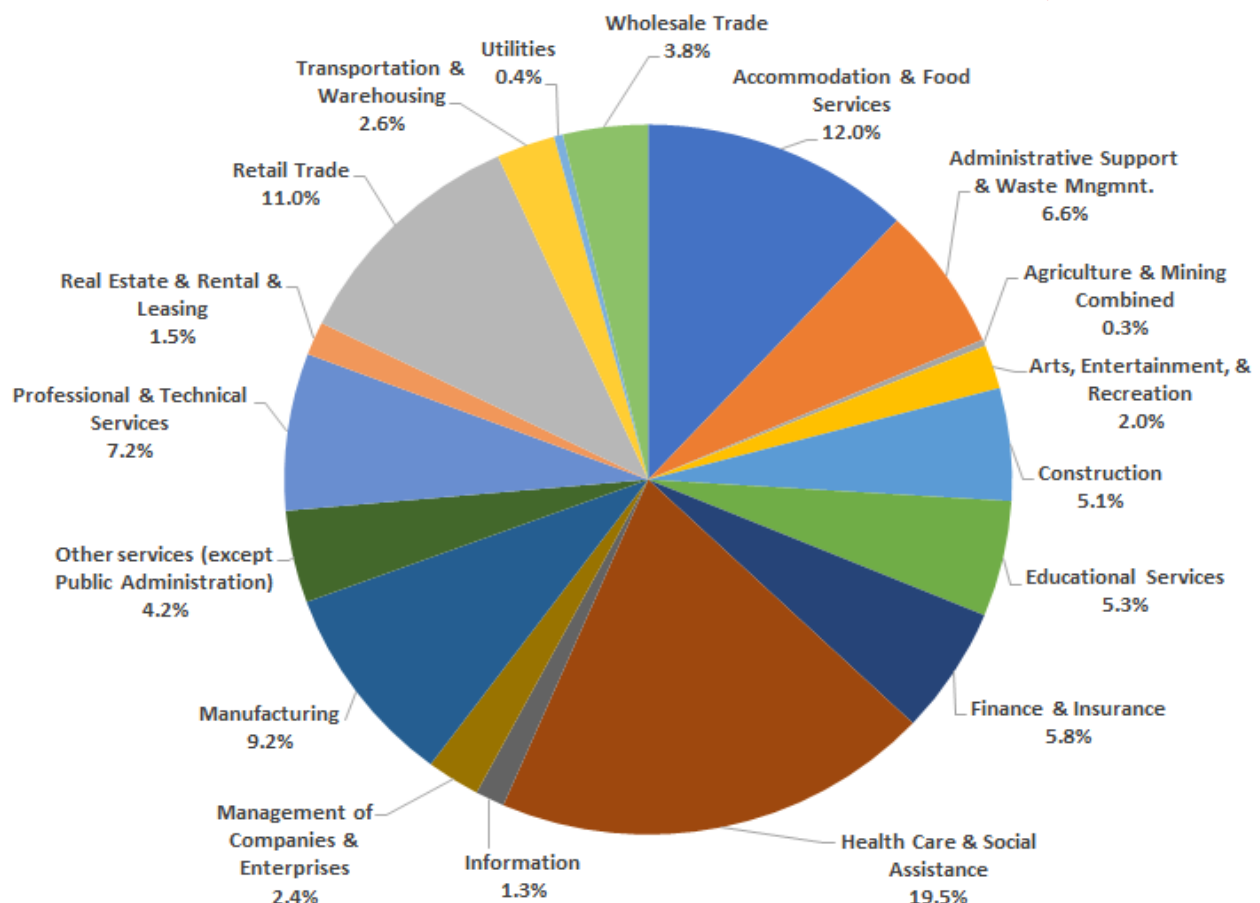
In 2024, the Health Care & Social Assistance (19.5%) industry sector employs the largest percentage of private Rhode Island workers, followed by Accommodation & Food Services (12.0%) and Retail Trade (11.0%).

In 2024, Providence (97,963) had the largest number of private sector workers in the state, followed by Warwick (43,925) and Cranston (29,279). Foster (402) and Little Compton (699) had the fewest number of workers.

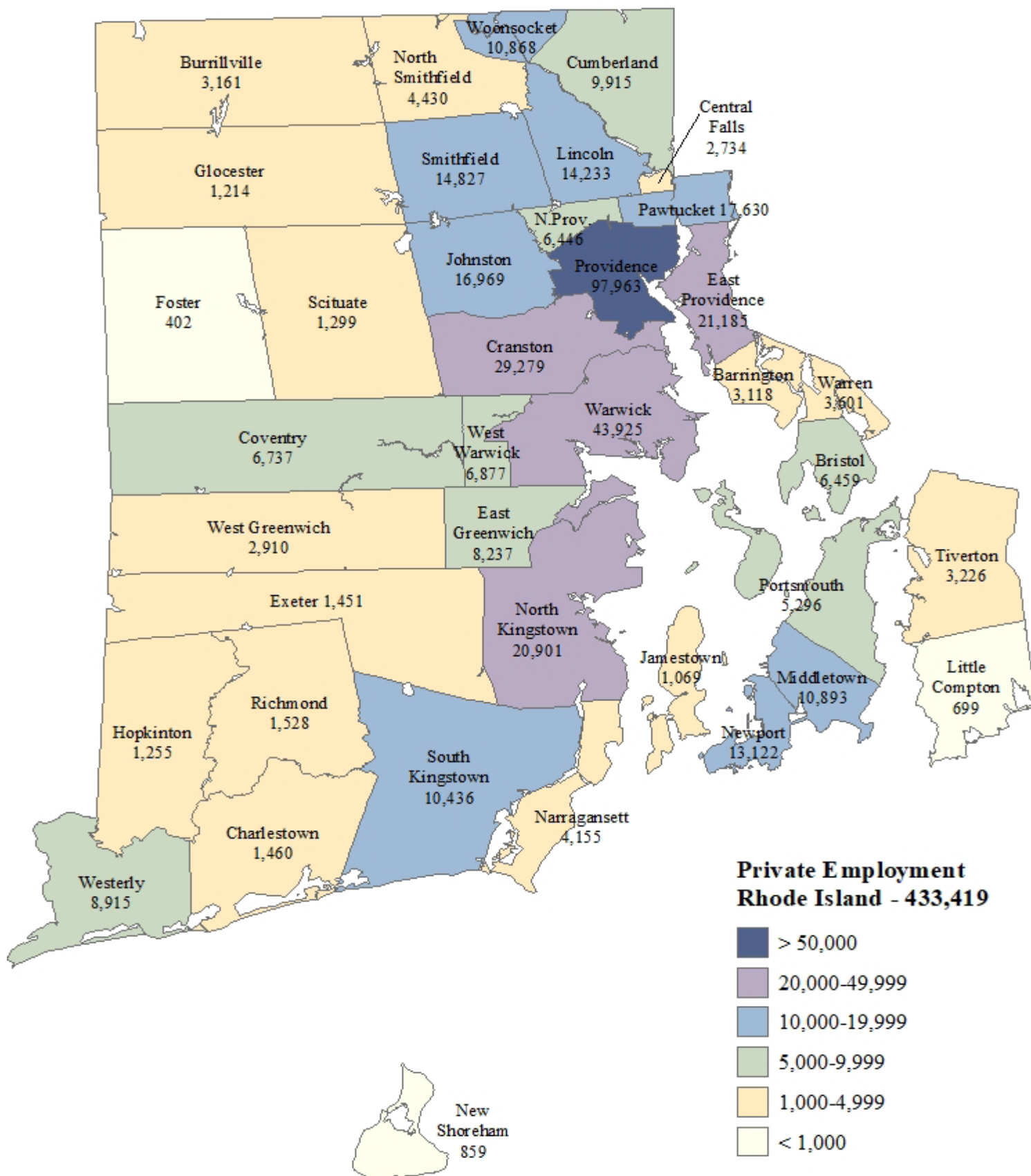

- Barrington's total population grew by 5.2 percent during the 2010's, with the addition of 843 people. Between 2020 and 2023, Barrington lost 40 (-0.2%) residents.
- 77.7 percent of Barrington residents 25 years and older had a college degree (Associate or higher) in 2023. The share of local residents without a high school diploma or GED decreased between 2010 and 2023, falling from 4.4 percent to 1.9 percent.
- Between 2023 and 2024, total employment in Barrington grew by 258 (+7.3%) jobs. Private sector employers reported a gain of 248 (+8.6%) jobs, while public sector employment increased by 10 (+1.5%) jobs. In comparison, statewide total employment grew by 7,199 (+1.5%) jobs.
- Barrington's unemployment rate averaged 2.1 percent in 2023, 4th lowest in the state and below the state average of 3.0 percent.

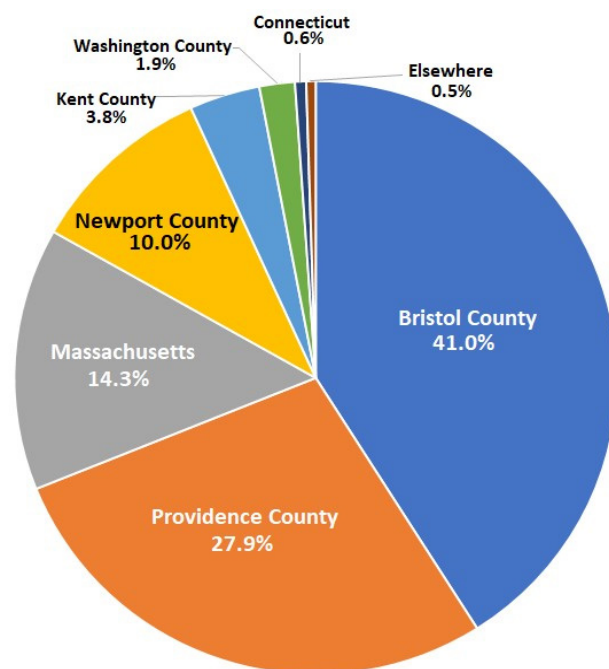

- Bristol's total population shrunk by 2.0 percent during the 2010's, with the loss of 461 people. Between 2020 and 2023, Bristol lost 176 (-0.8%) residents.
- Over half (52.6%) of Bristol residents 25 years and older had a college degree (Associate or higher) in 2023. The share of local residents without a high school diploma or GED decreased between 2010 and 2023, falling from 18.7 percent to 8.1 percent.
- Between 2023 and 2024, employment in Bristol increased by 173 (+2.3%) jobs. Private sector employers reported a gain of 132 (+2.1%) jobs, while public sector employment increased by 41 (+3.7%) jobs. In comparison, statewide total employment grew by 7,199 (+1.5%) jobs.
- Bristol's unemployment rate averaged 2.6 percent in 2023, tied for 15th lowest in the state and below the state average of 3.0 percent.

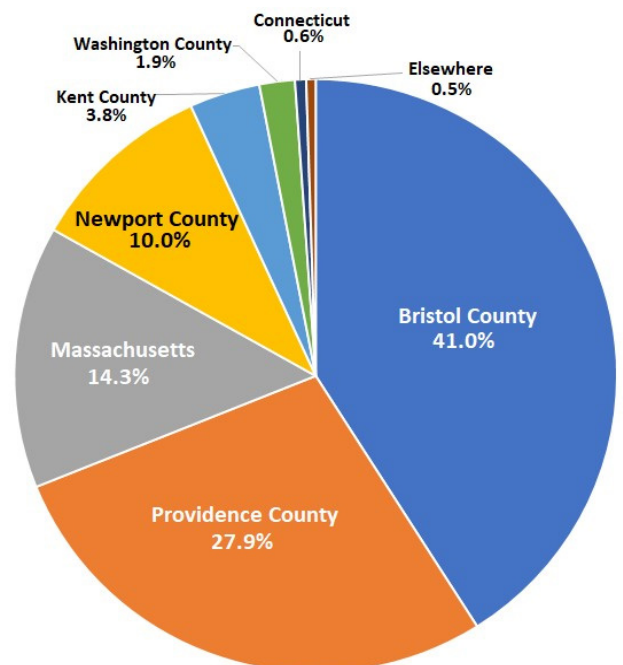

- Burrillville's total population grew by 1.3 percent during the 2010's, with the addition of 203 people. Between 2020 and 2023, Burrillville added 85 (+0.5%) residents.
- 36.6 percent of Burrillville's residents 25 years and older had a college degree (Associate or higher) in 2023. The share of local residents without a high school diploma or GED decreased between 2010 and 2023, falling from 17.4 percent to 6.7 percent.
- Between 2023 and 2024, employment in Burrillville grew by 192 (+5.2%) jobs. Private sector employers reported a gain of 193 (+6.5%) jobs, while public sector employment decreased by 1 (-0.1%) job. In comparison, statewide total employment grew by 7,199 (+1.5%) jobs.
- Burrillville's unemployment rate averaged 2.9 percent in 2023, tied for 26th lowest in the state and below the state average of 3.0 percent.

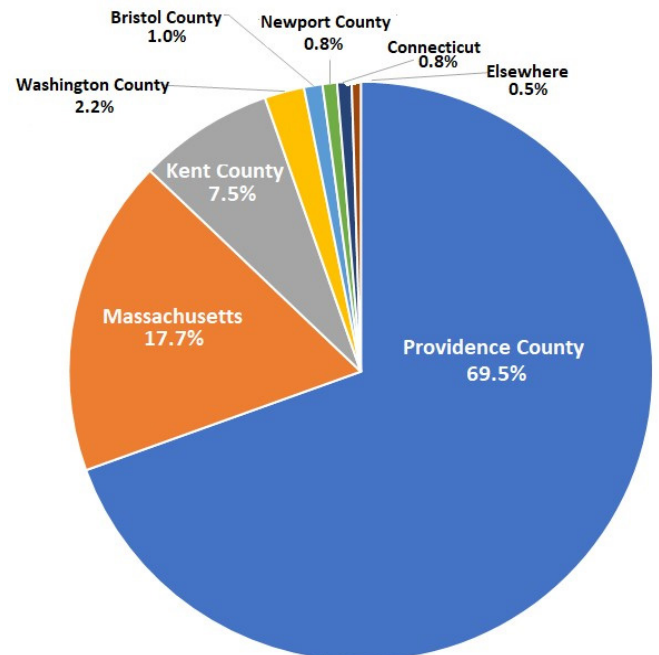

- Central Falls' total population grew by 16.6 percent during the 2010's, with the addition of 3,207 people. Between 2020 and 2023, Central Falls lost 102 (-0.5%) residents.
- 16.6 percent of Central Falls residents 25 years and older had a college degree (Associate or higher) in 2023. The share of local residents without a high school diploma or GED decreased between 2010 and 2023. While falling from 48.2 percent to 36.9 percent, Central Falls continued to have the highest percentage of residents without a high school diploma.
- Between 2023 and 2024, employment in Central Falls grew by 123 (+3.8%) jobs. Private sector employers reported a gain of 106 (+4.0%) jobs, while public sector employment increased by 17 (+2.6%) jobs. In comparison, statewide total employment grew by 7,199 (+1.5%) jobs.
- Central Falls' unemployment rate averaged 3.6 percent in 2023, tied for the fourth highest in the state and above the state average of 3.0 percent.

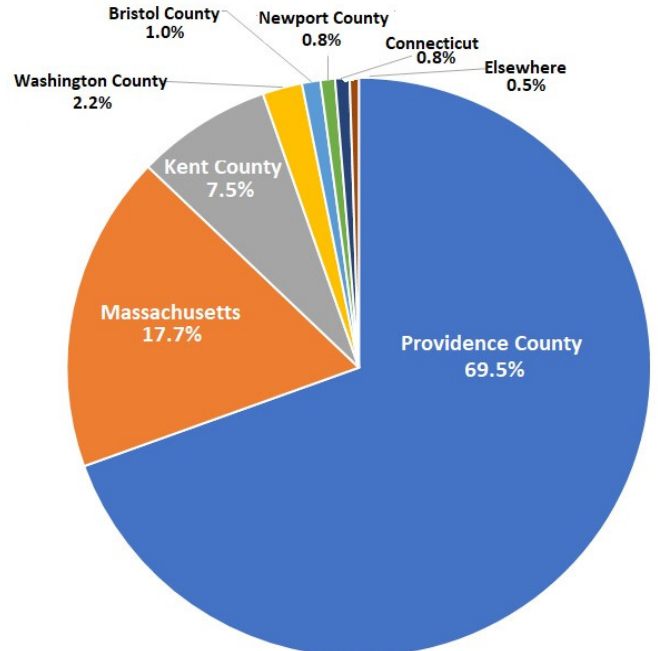

- Woonsocket's unemployment rate averaged 4.2 percent in 2023, the 2nd highest in the state and above the state average of 3.0 percent.

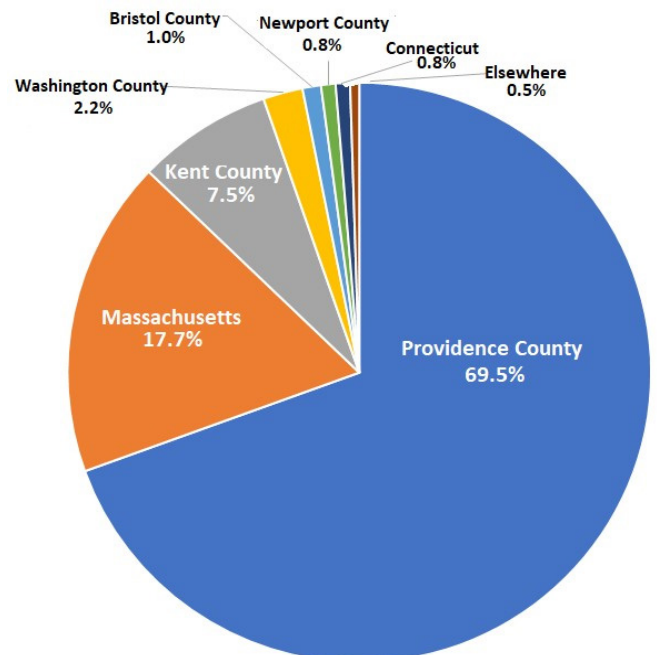
