Occupational Order

There are approximately 493,000 jobs in Rhode Island spanning twenty-two occupational groups. The statewide mean wage is \$33.30 per hour, with a median wage of \$25.98. Occupational groups with the highest hourly (mean) wages include Management (\$66.27), Architecture & Engineering (\$53.48), Computer & Mathematical (\$53.27) and Healthcare Practitioners & Technical (\$53.08) occupations.

Food Preparation & Serving and Personal Care & Service occupations offer mean wages below \$20 per hour. Employment is most concentrated in Office & Administrative Support, Food Preparation & Serving, and Sales-related roles. This distribution reflects a diverse workforce with significant opportunities in both high-skilled professional sectors and essential service industries.

The RI LMI uses the 10th percentile of wages as a proxy for entry-level wage rates, the 25th percentile of wages as a proxy for upper entry-level wage and the 75th percentile of wages as a proxy for experienced-level wages. The percentile data contained in this report are official BLS estimates. Rhode Island has chosen to label these percentiles as entry, upper entry and experience.

The Rhode Island Labor Market Information Division (LMI) uses the 10th percentile of wages as a proxy for entry-level wage rates, the 25th percentile of wages as a proxy for upper entry-level wage and the 75th percentile of wages as a proxy for experienced-level wages. The percentile data contained in this report are official BLS estimates. Rhode Island has chosen to label these percentiles as entry, upper entry and experience. Similarly, data on the typical education codes was not collected as part of the OEWS Survey, and the data contained in this report has been appended by Rhode Island to offer supplementary information for our users.

Annual salaries are reported for occupations with non-standard work weeks.

Wages for some occupations that do not generally work year-round, full-time, are reported either as hourly wages or annual salaries depending on how they are typically paid. For most occupations, annual wage estimates are calculated by multiplying mean or percentile hourly wage estimates by a “year-round, full time” figure of 2,080 hours (52 weeks x 40 hours) per year. These estimates, however, may not represent annual pay should the workers work more or less than 2,080 hours per year. Although OEWS publishes both annual and hourly wage estimates for most occupations, there are some occupations for which only annual or only hourly wages are published. For example, some workers such as teachers, pilots, and flight attendants are typically paid annual salaries, but work less than the usual 2,080 hours per year. Because the survey does not collect the actual number of hours worked, hourly wage rates cannot be derived from annual wage rates with any reasonable degree of confidence. Therefore, only annual wage estimates are published for these occupations. On the other hand, full-time, year-round work may not be typical in some occupations that are usually paid on an hourly basis, such as actors or musicians and singers. For these workers, only hourly wage estimates are published.”
