JOBSITE APPRENTICE to JOURNEYWORKER RATIOS ESTABLISHED IN BUILDING TRADES

For apprenticeships in the building trades minimum ratios are set by the state and must be met at the worksite at all times. The first number in the ratio is the number of apprentices, the second number is the number of journeyworkers. “1:1 then 1:3” means that the ratio is 1 apprentice to 1 journeyworker for the first apprentice and one apprentice to three journeyworkers for additional apprentices.
