
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In 2017, employment in Rhode Island averaged 477,305 with an average annual wage of \$52,837. Private sector employment averaged 417,962 with an average annual wage of \$50,929. Between 2016 and 2017 Rhode Island added 3,461 private sector jobs and the average annual private sector wage increased \$1,371, a 2.8% increase.

The Health Care & Social Assistance sector employed over 19% of the entire private sector workforce. Wages in the sector rose an average of \$795 or 1.7% compared to 2016.

The three cities with the largest share of private employment for 2017 in Rhode Island were Providence 97,659, Warwick 44,131 and Cranston 30,825. These cities hold over 41% of the employment in the private sector. The cities where the average annual wage was the highest for 2017 were Smithfield \$81,427, West Greenwich \$77,660 and Woonsocket \$66,707. Little Compton showed the largest percentage gain in employment compared to 2016 with a 6.4% increase in private sector employment followed by Hopkinton (6.1%) and Cumberland (4.7%). The largest numerical gains in private employment were in Lincoln (574), North Kingstown (470) and Cumberland (469).
