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# INTRODUCTION

## State of the State – A Statistical Profile of Rhode Island’s Cities and Towns

From Burrillville to Block Island, from Woonsocket to Westerly, recent demographic and employment trends have impacted the lives of all Rhode Islanders. Incorporating information collected by the United States Department of Commerce and the Rhode Island Department of Labor and Training, State of the State depicts demographic changes and recent employment trends that have impacted our local economies over the last twenty years.

Population diversity based on age, sex, race, and ethnicity, as well as educational attainment, labor force statistics, and English language proficiency of local residents, is encapsulated in statistical profiles for each of Rhode Island’s thirty-nine communities. An overview of local private sector employment by industry sector is also provided on a city and town basis.

# OVERVIEW

As of 2021, private job levels averaged 404,374, an increase of 19,254 (+5.0%) from the 2020 average. The unemployment rate is down 7.4 percentage points from 2009 to 3.2 percent in 2022. The state's population count stood at 1,091,949 in 2021, up 43,630 from 2000.

Thirty-seven of the state's thirty-nine cities and towns reported total employment growth between 2020-2021, with New Shoreham having the largest over-the-year increase (+22.9%). West Greenwich (-73) posted the largest total employment decrease.

Providence establishments employed the largest percentage (22.5%) of Rhode Island private sector workers, followed by Warwick (10.4%), Cranston (6.9%), East Providence (5.0%) and Pawtucket (4.2%).

Thirteen cities and towns gained residents, with Exeter (+398), Narragansett (+227) and Newport (+159) adding the most people. Of the twenty-six cities and towns that lost residents, Providence (-2,122), Pawtucket (-404) and New Shoreham (-403) lost the most. Year-over-year population change comparisons\* are harder to gauge when comparing a census year 2020 to an American Community Survey year of 2021. A more apples to apples comparison will be available when the 2022 American Community Survey estimates become available.

Rhode Island (3.2%) was tied for the 22nd lowest annual average unemployment rate in the country in 2022. Nevada (5.4%), had the highest rate in the country. The annual average unemployment rate for the United States as a whole in 2022 was 3.6 percent.

Rhode Island's total population increased by 4.5 percent during the 1990's, with the gain of 44,855 people, while between 2000 and 2021, Rhode Island gained 43,630 (+4.2%) residents.

Over forty-three percent (43.5%) of Rhode Island residents 25 years and older had a college degree (Associate or higher) in 2021. The share of state residents without a high school diploma or GED decreased between 2000 and 2021, falling from 22.0 percent to 10.9 percent.

Between 2019 and 2021, employment in Rhode Island decreased by 21,693 (-4.5%) jobs. Private sector employers reported a loss of 19,984 (-4.7%) jobs, while public sector employment declined by 1,709 (-2.8%) jobs.

## Language Population Age 18-64, 2021

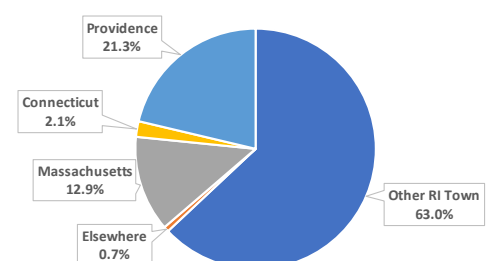

# STATE OF RHODE ISLAND

The percentage of Rhode Islanders who spoke only English or spoke another language and English either well or very well increased from 94.7 percent in 2010 to 95.9 percent in 2021.

The percentage of total residents aged 18 to 64 that spoke Spanish while speaking English either not well or not at all decreased from 3.7 in 2010 to 3.6 in 2021, representing 25.8 percent of all Spanish-speaking Rhode Islanders.

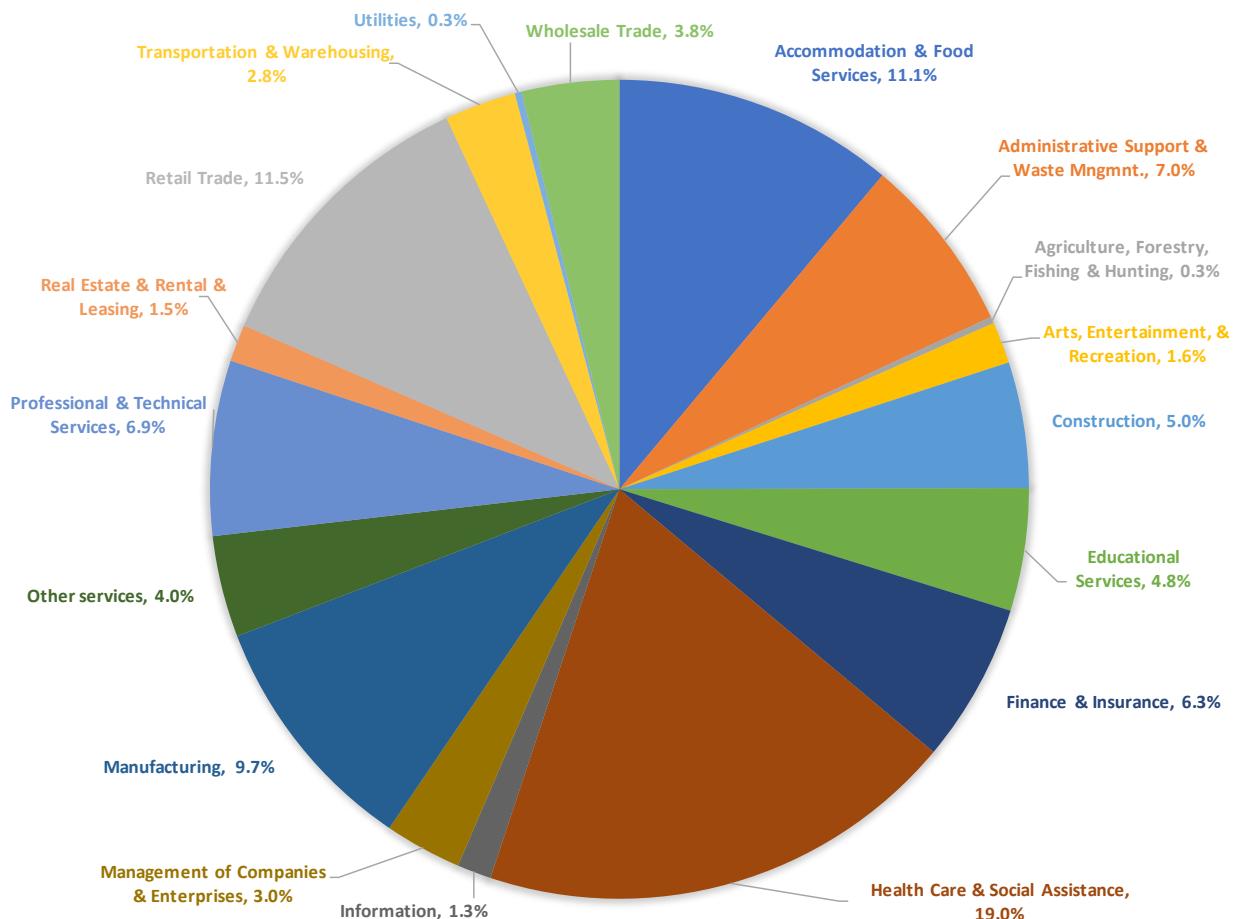
The Health Care & Social Assistance (19.2%) industry sector employs the largest percentage of private Rhode Island workers, followed by Accommodation & Food Services (12.3%) and Retail Trade (11.3%).

Providence (98,987) had the largest number of private sector workers in the state, followed by Warwick (44,708) and Cranston (29,505). Foster (336) and Little Compton (639) had the fewest number of workers.

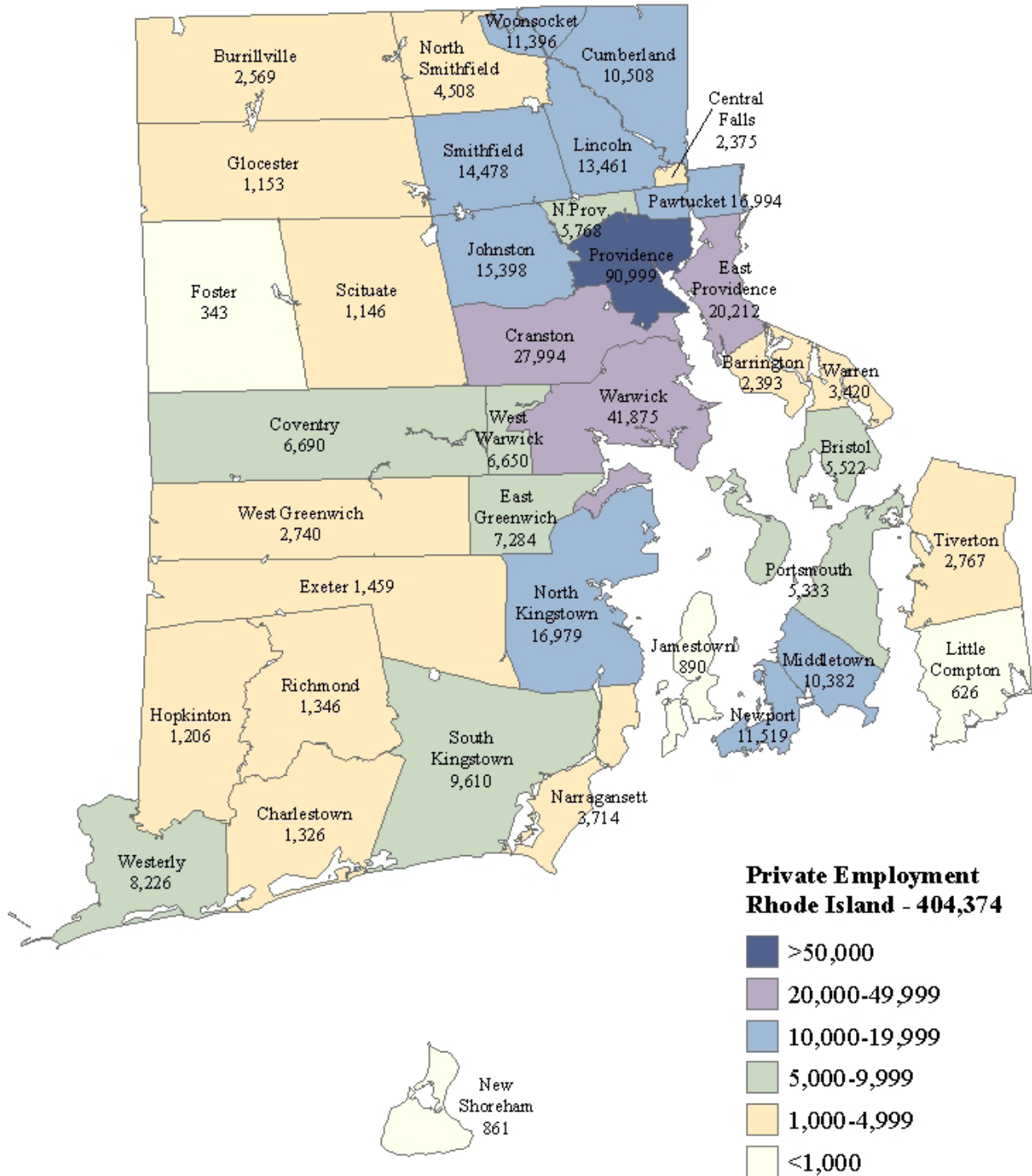

- Barrington's total population grew by 6.1 percent during the 1990's, with the addition of 970 people, between 2000 and 2021, Barrington added another 382 (+2.3%) residents.
- 77.7 percent of Barrington residents 25 years and older had a college degree (Associate or higher) in 2021. The share of local residents without a high school diploma or GED decreased between 2000 and 2021, falling from 7.7 percent to 2.3 percent.
- Between 2020 and 2021, total employment in Barrington grew by 193 (+6.8%) jobs. Private sector employers reported a gain of 158 (+7.1%) jobs, while public sector employment increased by 36 (+5.7%) jobs. In comparison, statewide total employment grew by 19,254 (+5.0%) jobs.
- Barrington's unemployment rate averaged 2.1 percent in 2022, tied for 2nd lowest in the state and below the state average of 3.2 percent.

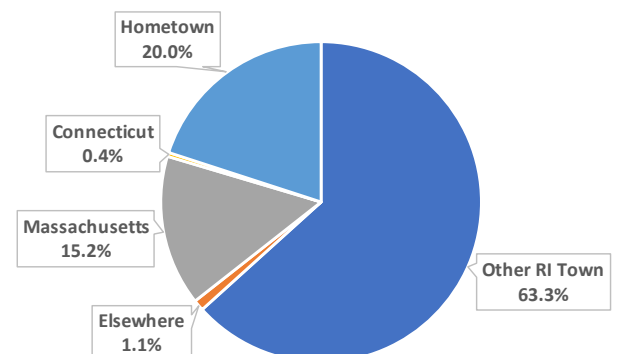

- Bristol's total population grew by 3.9 percent during the 1990's, with the addition of 844 people. However, between 2000 and 2021, Bristol lost 164 (-0.7%) residents.

- Almost half (47.8%) of Bristol residents 25 years and older had a college degree (Associate or higher) in 2021. The share of local residents without a high school diploma or GED decreased between 2000 and 2021, falling from 25.9 percent to 11.6 percent.

- Between 2020 and 2021, employment in Bristol increased by 208 (+3.2%) jobs. Private sector employers reported a gain of 210 (+4.0%) jobs. Statewide total employment grew by 19,254 (+5.0%) jobs.

Bristol's unemployment rate averaged 2.8 percent in 2022, tied for 13th lowest in the state and below the state average of 3.2 percent.

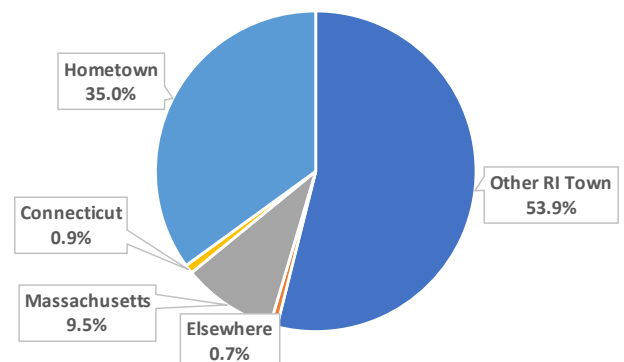
## Language Population Age 18-64, 2021

- Burrillville's total population shrunk by 2.7 percent during the 1990's, with the loss of 434 people. Between 2000 and 2021, Burrillville added 390 (+2.5%) residents.
- 36.8 percent of Burrillville's residents 25 years and older had a college degree (Associate or higher) in 2021. The share of local residents without a high school diploma or GED decreased between 2000 and 2021, falling from 19.6 percent to 8.4 percent.
- Between 2020 and 2021, employment in Burrillville grew by 160 (+5.0%) jobs. Private sector employers reported a gain of 187 (+7.8%) jobs, while public sector employment decreased by 28 (-3.5%) jobs. In comparison, statewide total employment grew by 19,254 (+5.0%) jobs.
- Burrillville's unemployment rate averaged 3.1 percent in 2022, below the state average of 3.2 percent.

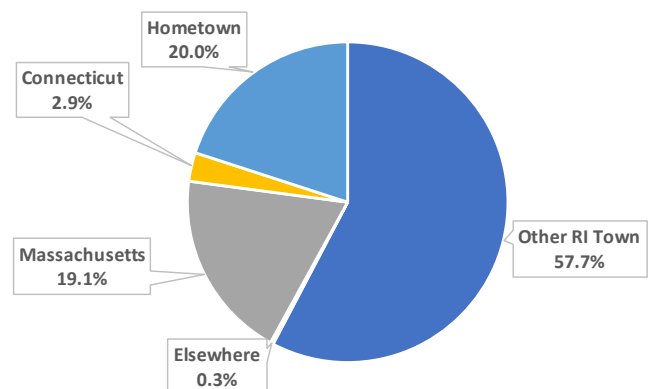

- Central Falls' total population grew by 7.3 percent during the 1990's, with the addition of 1,291 people. Between 2000 and 2021, Central Falls added another 3,264 (+17.2%) residents.
- 15.1 percent of Central Falls residents 25 years and older had a college degree (Associate or higher) in 2021. The share of local residents without a high school diploma or GED decreased between 2000 and 2021. While falling from 50.9 percent to 39.3 percent, Central Falls continued to have the highest percentage of residents without a high school diploma.
- Between 2020 and 2021, employment in Central Falls grew by 236 (+8.6%) jobs. Private sector employers reported a gain of 183 (+8.3%) jobs, while public sector employment increased by 53 (+9.8%) jobs.
- Central Falls' unemployment rate averaged 3.9 percent in 2022, the fourth highest in the state and above the state average of 3.2 percent.

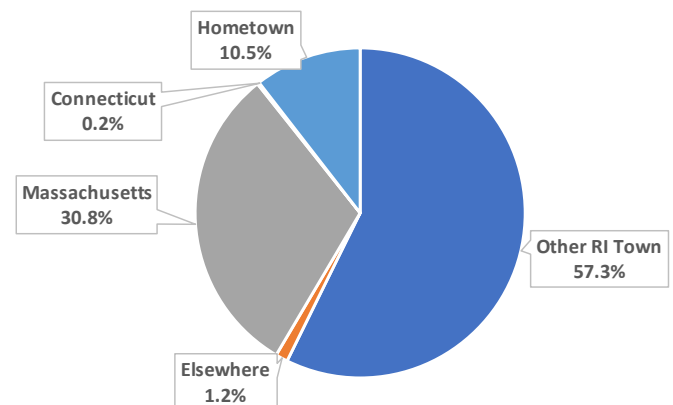

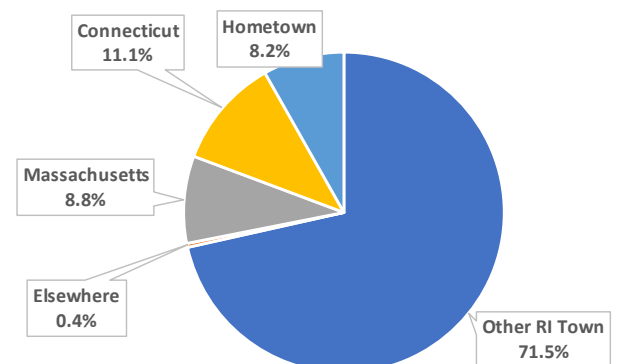

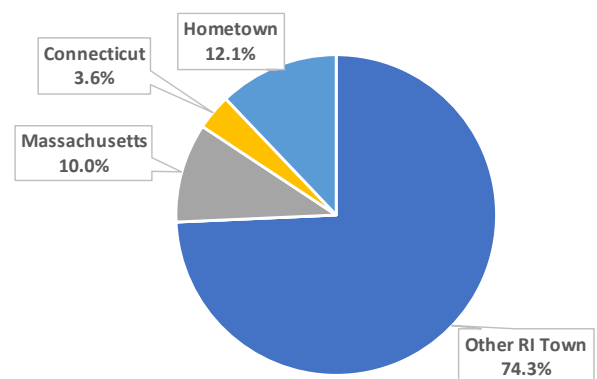

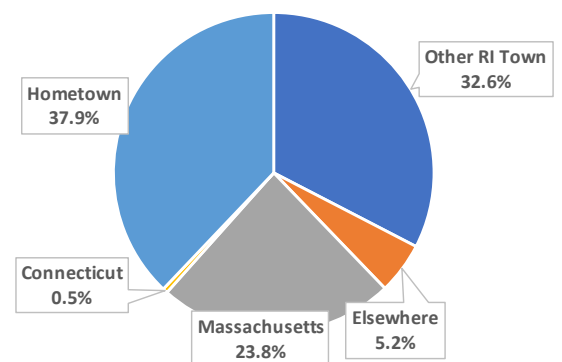

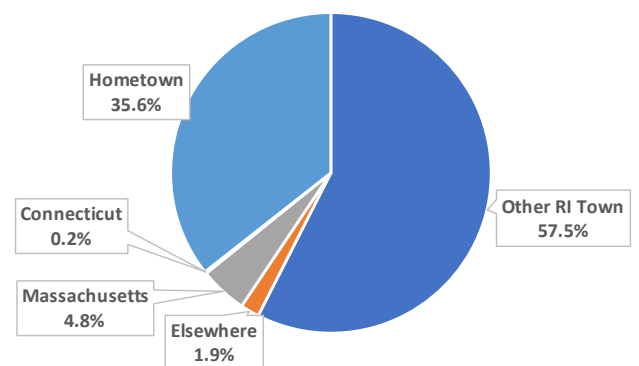

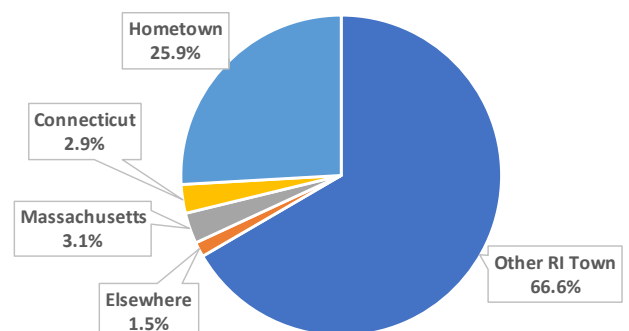

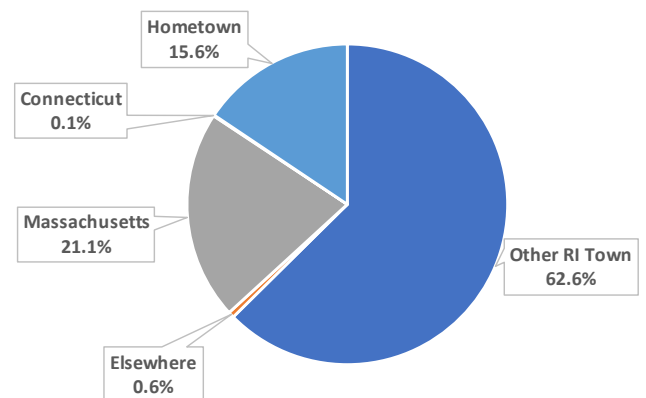

- Woonsocket's total population decreased by 1.5 percent during the 1990's, with the loss of 653 people. Between 2000 and 2021, Woonsocket lost another 180 residents.
- 26.8 percent of Woonsocket residents 25 years and older had a college degree (Associate or higher) in 2021. The share of local residents without a high school diploma or GED decreased between 2000 and 2021, falling from 36.0 percent to 18.1 percent.
- Between 2020 and 2021, employment in Woonsocket increased by 73 (+0.6%) jobs. Private sector employers reported a gain of 80 (+0.7%) jobs, while public sector employment fell by 6 (-0.4%) jobs. In comparison, statewide total employment grew by 19,254 (+5.0%) jobs.
- Woonsocket's unemployment rate averaged 4.3 percent in 2022, the 2nd highest in the state and above the state average of 3.2 percent.
- Nearly one-quarter (24.7%) of Woonsocket residents work in Woonsocket, while 38.1 percent work outside of RI.

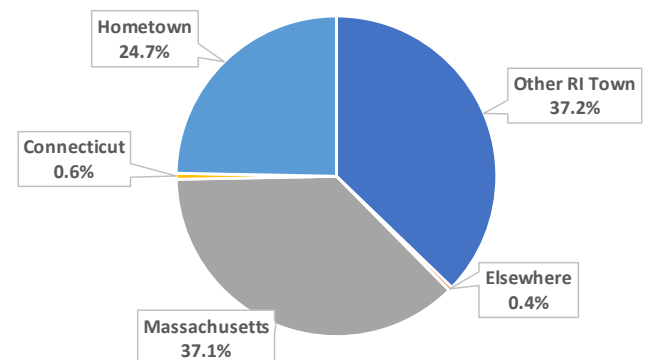
