



Division of Workers' Compensation  
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The Rhode Island Department of Labor and Training will be implementing electronic reporting of workers' compensation first reports of injury (FROI) and subsequent reports of injury (SROI). The SROI covers Reports of Indemnity Payment, Reports of Specific Payment and Itemized Statements. Electronic reporting will be required for all trading partners: insurers, self-insured employers, and claim administrators. Voluntary implementation is planned for March 1, 2014. Mandatory implementation is planned for January 1, 2015. Testing will be available beginning January 1, 2014.

Electronic reporting will be via Electronic Data Interchange (EDI) transactions using the Claims 3.0 reporting standards adopted by the International Association of Industrial Accident Boards and Commissions (IAIABC). The Rhode Island Department of Labor and Training has contracted with Insurance Services Office, Inc. (ISO) to manage its FROI and SROI reporting. ISO will be administering registration of trading partners, testing, and data collection and submission of EDI data to the State.
