Information Letter 2021-04 July 28th, 2021

## **Compensation Rate**

On July 14th, Governor McKee signed Senate Bill 0937 Substitute A into law<sup>1</sup>. This legislation greatly simplifies the computation of a worker's compensation rate.

Effective January 1st 2022 for <a href="new">new</a> injuries, intermediate spendable base wage (SBW) calculations will be discontinued; the compensation rate will equal 62% of the claimant's average weekly wage. This change applies to both (a.) new injuries occurring on or after January 1st 2022, and (b.) post-2021 recurrences of previous injuries where the claimant returned to work for an intermediate period of 26 or more weeks. <a href="Allongoing">Allongoing</a>, pre-2022 claims will continue to use the spendable base wage formula established for the relevant base year.

Absent additional legislation, the new 62% compensation rate is not subject to periodic revision. The Division will continue to archive prior years' SBW formulas and tables<sup>2</sup>, but no further compensation rate publications or announcements will be made each May.

This change offers reduced paper filing requirements:

- The Employee's Certificate of Dependency Status (DWC-04)³ will no longer be required for temporary partial incapacities. It must still be filed for total incapacities to document potential dependents' allowances (§ 28-33-17). Please also note the unchanged electronic filing (EDI) requirements dependency information should continue to be collected and transmitted as part of electronic First Reports (FROI transactions).
- "Spendable base wage" fields on all DWC forms may be disregarded for any incapacity subject to the new 62% compensation rate.
